WHEREAS, the Texas Legislature had amended the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code under House Bill 79 (82-1) to add section 15.0821 requiring Justices of the Peace in each county to adopt, by majority vote, local rules for the transfer of a pending case from one precinct to a different precinct,

NOW THEREFORE, we the undersigned Justices of the Peace, being a majority of the Justices of the Peace in Victoria County, Texas, do hereby adopt the following Rules for Transfer of Civil which shall govern the transfer of civil cases for the Justice Courts in Victoria County, Texas:

RULES FOR TRANSFER OF CIVIL CASES

Rule 1. EXCHANGE OF BENCHES. A justice of the peace may hold court, exchange benches, or hear civil cases for any other justice at the request of that justice without the necessity of an order and without the necessity of transferring the case to the other court.

- Rule 2. TRANSFER OF CASES. A case may be transferred from one justice court to another having jurisdiction:
- 1. Upon motion of a party, for good cause shown;
- 2. In the event the justice is disqualified to hear or recuses himself or herself from hearing the case;
- 3. When the case should be transferred in the interest of justice;
- 4. By agreement of all counsel and/or parties *pro se* and of the court transferring the case, and of the transferee court; or

5. When required by a rule of law or venue.

Rule 3. NO TRANSFER WITHOUT CONSENT. No case may be transferred except upon the consent of the justice of the court to which the case is being transferred, unless the transfer is required by a rule of law or venue.

Rule 3. VIEWING AND PUBLICATION. These Rules for Transfer of Civil Cases shall be available to the public at the offices of each Justice of the Peace. These Rules for Transfer of Civil Cases shall also be posted on the webpage for the Justice Courts on the official website for Victoria County, Texas.

Rule 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. These Rules of Transfer of Civil Cases Administration shall be take effect January 1, 2012.

Rule 5. AMENDMENTS. These Rules for Transfer of Civil Cases may be amended by the majority vote of the Justice of the Peace in Victoria County, Texas.
